This milestone marked the beginning of a more inclusive chapter for our community. In 2024, Hartmann House followed suit by opening the Paul Miki ECD Centre to girls in Grade 0 and looking ahead to 2026, the College look's forward to welcoming girls into Form 1.

By thoughtfully integrating girls throughout the Red Blazer Route, we are fostering a vibrant, co-educational environment that nurtures leadership, compassion, and excellence. We believe that this inclusive approach will empower every pupil to grow into a confident, thoughtful agent of positive change. The unique perspectives and talents our young women bring are already enriching our classrooms, our culture, and our entire school community.

To date, over 100 girls collectively have journeyed through St George's College and Hartmann House. Their outstanding academic results in Cambridge International Examinations (Sixth Form), along with their exceptional contributions to sport and culture on a national level (Sixth Form), are a powerful testament to the success and impact of this inclusive vision. 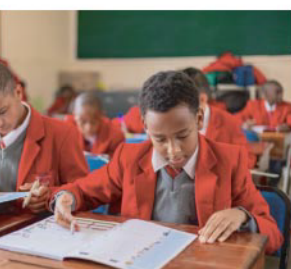
Cambridge Grade 6 Checkpoint Examination Results Analysis 2024

DAY BOARDING STRUCTURE

Once pupils are dropped off at school at 7:10am, a variety of lessons take place throughout the morning, with break time at 10:30am and Reflection Time at 12.00pm. This allows our pupils to reflect on their achievements during the day in the presence of God and consider what they aim to accomplish for the rest of the day. Lunchtime begins at 1:00pm, during which pupils can bring their own food.

Following lunch, all pupils change into their sports kits and return to their classrooms with their teachers to complete their homework. At 2:30pm, pupils attend a club (cultural activity) that changes every six weeks. They then proceed directly to sports, which concludes at 4:45pm. Afterward, they get dressed appropriately to be picked up and head home.

Our Day Boarding structure ensures that pupils typically bring home only reading and spelling assignments, allowing for **more family time!**
